He began his career in the United States Army in 1989. In his 31 year career, he has served in the Regular Army and the Army National Guard. He graduated from the United States Army Sergeant Major Academy. His most recent assignments are as the Command Sergeant Major of Multinational Battle Group- East, Kosovo Forces and the 37th Infantry Brigade Combat Team of the Ohio Army National Guard.

Command Sergeant Major Schuster is a graduate of Miami University. He currently serves as a Deputy Sheriff Sergeant assigned as a shift supervisor for the Butler County Sheriff's Office Road Patrol Division.
